Dear G. F.:

I received your excellent letter and request for taped sermons to be used on your local radio station. I know of nothing that would help the work there more than such an effort. Unfortunately, all the mission funds of this congregation are assigned for the year totaling \$17,000. I would suggest that, if you still desire, you may write the Missions Committee whose chairman is John Mott, one of our elders. You can address the letter in care of the church here, and it will be handed to them. They might be able to find some funds to support such a program.

Unfortunately, the only tapes I have available are tapes of my Sunday morning and Sunday night sermons which are 30 to 45 minutes in length. I would suggest that you write Brother W.F. Cawyer at the Highland Church in Abilene and ask for information about Herald of Truth's special 15-minute program. In fact, we now have a 5 and a 15-minute program narrated by Robert Holton and written by Dan Harless. I am sure these tapes would be provided free of charge. You might even get the 5-minute program placed on the station as a daily public service by allowing the station manager to hear it.

Thank you so much for your letter, but I deeply regret being unable to provide any further assistance. After September 1 I will be in Abilene and will be happy to do whatever I can for you there.
