There is no adequate way to express my joy and happiness at becoming acquainted with you during our North Bay Campaign. It seems that every time the going gets a little difficult the Lord always leads me into contact with a dedicated young Christian like yourself and spurs me to continue the work that I know must be done. Your letter is one of those unforgetables that I will always treasure.

I am deeply concerned at this point about your future as it effects your effectiveness for Christ. Above everything else right now you need to be at Abilene and I want to urge that you make the decision to go. It now looks like my family and I will be moving in September, 1966 to Abilene. I had a call waiting for me from the Highland Elders when I arrived home Saturday evening.

Please let me know how things go through the summer and be assured that I think about you and pray for you.
