Dear Joe:

Your kind letter was received today and your plans for future meetings well accepted. From all reports the work at Central is at its most dynamic peak. You have certainly transformed a sleeping giant into a great work for God.

Unfortunately, there is no way I can definitely schedule a one Sunday meeting sooner than 1972. At this point I can't even give you three or four days until 1971. I will be in a position after September, 1966, to possibly come for a short meeting in the months that follow that date but can make no commitments until then. It now appears certain that I will be in Abilene with Herald of Truth. Of course you realize there has been no publicity release and this must be considered unofficial until that time.

Should you desire to definitely schedule the long meeting for '72, I would be open for suggestions as to dates, with my only reservation or request being that the meeting begin on Sunday morning and conclude on Friday evening. The only solution on the short meeting at this point seems to be either scheduling it for 1971 or taking a chance on getting it much sooner after September, 1966.

The Stites family were thrilled by their visit to Amarillo. They came back even more inspired Christians than they had been before. Our best wishes to your good work.
