Dear Brother White:

I had heard in outline form of the proposed state-wide campaign for Christ scheduled in California. This idea seems to be a wonderful way to make a mass assault with the gospel of Christ on such a great segment of the U.S. population. There are very special problems and factors to be recognized in an attempt to present Christ to West Coast citizens especially, I think, in southern California.

I am pleased to consider the possibility of working with the Inglewood Church and sister congregations in the Shrine Auditorium meeting. Fortunately, I have no meetings scheduled for the week of October 22. I will conclude a meeting in Fort Worth, Texas, on Wednesday night, October 18, and will be free throughout the next week.

I am happy that you have contacted the Highland elders in Abilene under whom I will be working as of January 1, 1966, and later living in Abilene as of September 1, 1966. Please accept my affirmative reply to your inquiry and feel free to make whatever plans you feel necessary in view of this answer. I will expect to hear from you as plans become more definite and will understand if sister congregations feel another speaker would be more desirable. I send you and the good church there my very best wishes and prayers as you begin working toward this great effort.
