

Dear Archie:

Sue and I appreciated your recent letter about housing possibilities. Thank you for being willing to keep an eye open for our needs. I also appreciated the kind remarks about the recent article in the Advocate. I was pleased that they were willing to publish it in view of what I had felt in recent months to be some tensions developing at the Advocate regarding me and my articles.

Sue and I are in a quandry about the housing situation. We will probably take a seminary apartment, if and when one becomes available. We would also be interested in leasing a house on a long-term basis if we found one reasonable enough and big enough to take care of our needs. We have also considered buying an older house in one of the changing neighborhoods near by, but do not feel this to be the wisest direction to take. We are also in the process of trying to uncover an apartment complex where we could live in as resident managers without any great responsibilities.

Anything along any of these lines that you happen to run across that looks attractive, from the standpoint of price, please let us know. Our big problem is budget--we simply do not want to put a lot of money into a house like we have here in Abilene. Any recommendations that might even be contrary to the vague guidelines I have suggested here would be appreciated.

We will be unable to get to Atlanta anytime soon. In fact, we may simply have to find a place in the process of the move itself. Thank you so much for being helpful.
