FROM THE PRESIDENT

Learning how to give by following the master giver

When considering one-word adjectives for our Savior, my list soon ends when I arrive at the life-changing word for all mankind — giving. Christ “gave it all” in every facet of his life on earth. He gave food on a hillside, life to Lazarus, purpose to a fisherman, forgiveness to an adulterer, hope to a mother, freedom to a murderer, and to crown his giving, he gave himself. 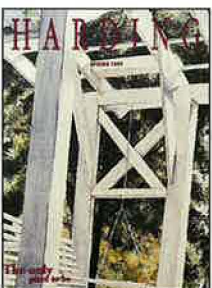

This type of service can take many forms including serving on local civic groups, holding public office, helping flood victims and sharing Christ with those we come in contact with. The greater number of Christians serving our nations, the greater chance we have of saving our nations.

Moving on up — cafeteria adding second story

DUE TO THE IMMENSE GROWTH IN student population the past few years, ARAMARK Corporation, the University's contracted food-service provider, is adding a 10,000-square-foot second story to the existing cafeteria.

The addition comes as the result of overcrowding in the cafeteria, especially during the peak dining time from 11:45 a.m. to 12:45 p.m.

Charlie Liming, ARAMARK district manager for Arkansas, is helping plan and oversee the project. "Our main mission at Harding is to serve the students," he said. "We've seen this need coming for a long time and are now ready to address it with this large expansion plan."

The cost of expansion and remodeling totals approximately \$1.1 million, and funding for the project comes exclusively from the ARAMARK Corporation.

"We have spent a lot of time with ARAMARK working on solutions to our overcrowding problem," said President David Burks, "and we feel that this expansion is the best possible answer. Our main mission in this effort is to accommodate the student body and provide for the needs of our students."

The last expansion in the cafeteria was nine years ago when the back dining room and banquet rooms were added. At that time there were approximately 1,800 students on meal plans. Since that time, the number of students on meal plans has increased to approximately 2,200 — a trend that is expected to continue. To compensate for this growth, one of the back dining rooms, formerly used exclusively for meetings and banquets, will be utilized as student dining space. The result will increase the student dining area by 20 percent.

The second-floor addition will

house three large dining rooms with partitions and three smaller rooms that can be used as either dining or meeting rooms. These rooms will be used mainly by off-campus patrons as well as for functions on campus that, in the past, have required the use of extensive student dining space in the cafeteria.

There will also be changes to the cafeteria's exterior. A main entrance will be added on the Grand Street side of the building, and the

student entrance will be opened up and expanded to allow for better traffic flow and more room for backpacks.

Traffic flow will also be improved in the existing cafeteria. The walls containing the beverage stations will be completely removed and the beverage stations will be moved to more convenient locations.

Construction began the end of February and is to be completed by the beginning of the fall semester.

Association accredits graduate program

THE GRADUATE SCHOOL OF RELIGION in Memphis, Tenn., reached another milestone in January with the announcement of its accreditation by the Association of Theological Schools (ATS).

ATS granted the maximum five-year accreditation to the school which held candidacy status for three years before being accredited. The Graduate School of Religion is the only school among churches of Christ to achieve ATS accreditation.

With 224 member institutions, ATS is the primary accrediting organization in the United States

and Canada. It has been providing accreditation review of theological schools since 1938.

According to Dean Bill Flatt, ATS recognition has definite benefits for students, including easy mobility for students transferring to and from leading theological schools, additional access to scholarships, and the assurance of quality programs being offered.

In making its announcement, ATS cited faculty credentials, library holdings, teaching and research skills available to students, academic quality and location as strengths of the program.

Community support noted in naming of Searcy Hall

THE UNIVERSITY'S NEW WOMEN'S apartment building was officially dedicated as Searcy Hall during ceremonies Nov. 14.

According to President David Burks, the building's name recognizes the support the Searcy community has given to the University for more than 60 years.

"The citizens of Searcy and White County have had a major part in the success of Harding," Burks said, "and every time someone sees the building and the name it bears, they will be reminded of how much this University appreciates its hometown."

A plaque bearing the names of individuals and businesses that contributed to the most recent Searcy-White County Fund Drive hangs in the lobby of the new facility. The successful campaign raised more than \$1.3 million.

Addressing the dedication crowd were Burks, Searcy Mayor David Evans, and student Allison Rector, who spoke on behalf of Searcy Hall's residents and thanked contributors for their part in making the facility possible.

Mabee Foundation provides \$1 million challenge grant

FUND-RAISING EFFORTS IN THE "Dream Continues" Campaign received a boost with an announcement by the Mabee Foundation of a \$1 million challenge grant.

After meeting in January, the foundation's board of directors announced the challenge grant will be used toward the \$14.5 million final phase of the campaign. To meet the conditions of the grant, the University must secure \$4 million in gifts and pledges by Jan. 15, 1998.

The \$14.5 million final phase of the campaign includes eight capital projects. To date Harding has received \$9.5 million in gifts and pledges toward the \$14.5 million total.

The four yet to be funded include renovation projects involving Rhodes Field House and the Olen Hendrix Building. Also to be funded are the expansion of the art center and a new entrance on the south side of the campus.

Harding's relationship with the Mabee Foundation spans more than 40 years. During that time the Foundation has provided grants totaling more than \$6 million for various projects, including the Mabee American Heritage Center and the school's two largest classroom buildings, the Mabee Business Center and the McInter Bible and World Missions Center.

Hazelip honored at Graduate School of Religion dinner

DR. HAROLD HAZELIP, DEAN OF THE University's Graduate School of Religion in Memphis, Tenn., from 1973 to 1986, was "mildly roasted" at a fund-raising dinner held in his honor at the Memphis Botanic Garden's Hardin Hall on March 7.

Organized under the leadership of Jay Shappley, chairman of the school's advisory council, the event was attended by more than 200 of Hazelip's friends, including former Graduate School fellow employees, David Lipscomb University associates, and members of his former church home at Highland Street Church of Christ.

The dinner raised more than \$10,000, enough to completely furnish an apartment in the new housing facility being built on the campus.

Hazelip is retiring this year from the presidency of David Lipscomb University, a position he has held for the past 11 years.

Criminal justice offered as new major

A NEW 36-HOUR MAJOR JOINTLY offered by the behavioral science and political science departments will enable the University to better fulfill the job demand available in the rapidly growing criminal justice field.

The new major, approved in December, is set for a fall 1997 debut. A series of new courses will be phased in during the next two fall semesters. Already six students are working toward the degree, and that number is expected to rapidly increase.

"This basically came about because of student demand," said Dr. Kathy Howard, associate professor of sociology. "We've had so many interested in this area, but never had the courses to support the major."

Seven new courses have been added and two that existed in the behavioral sciences curriculum have been revised to better complement the new major.

New courses to be offered include Criminal Justice System, Judicial Process, Criminal Law, Professionalism and Ethics in Criminal Justice, Correctional Counseling, and a required internship. The four political science courses required for the major are American Political Institutions, Constitutional Law, Administrative Law, and American, State and Local Government.

Howard was part of a seven-member committee of faculty and administrators who spent five months compiling the new major. The committee worked with officials at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock and Sam Houston University — schools that both have well-respected criminal justice programs.

The result of their months of work is a program of study not offered in-house at any other universities affiliated with churches of Christ.

While at the fall conference of AFSCEC in Hot Springs, Ark., Silva was selected outstanding student member for Arkansas.

"Ice breaking" held for Graduate School apartment facility; name will honor Benson

BITTERLY COLD WEATHER GREETED ground-breaking ceremony participants Jan. 14 when the University's Graduate School of Religion in Memphis, Tenn., officially began construction on a new apartment facility.

"This is the first time I've ever conducting a ground breaking in the snow," President David Burks quipped to a gathering of nearly 50 people who braved the frigid weather.

The new two-story apartment facility will house 20 students and will be named in honor of the late Dr. George S. Benson, second president of the University and the driving force behind the creation of the graduate campus in Memphis.

It will replace Kendall Hall, which will be razed. Built more than 30 years ago, it was deemed too costly to renovate and refurbish.

The school's other housing facility, Harding-Brewer Apartments, will be renovated upon completion of the new apartments.

The project is part of the school's three-year Housing Renovation Campaign that began in 1995. More than \$350,000 of the campaign's \$500,000 goal has been raised.

Joining Flatt in the ground breaking were Burks; Lott Tucker, senior vice president of the University; Jay Shappley, a Memphis businessman and chairman of the school's advisory council; and Rick Wood, president of the Student Association. Flatt used a backhoe tractor to ceremonially unearth the construction site.

The Graduate School enrolled 221 students this past fall. Thirty-five actually live in campus housing, including a majority of the school's international students.

Graduate School hosts seminar series to aid local congregations

A SERIES OF CONGREGATIONAL Ministry Seminars seeking to enhance spiritual growth within local congregations will be conducted over a two-year period by the Graduate School of Religion in Memphis, Tenn.

Organized by Dr. Evertt Huffard, professor of missions, the series will be offered June 6-7 and Sept. 26-27 this year, with three seminars scheduled for 1998.

"If we can provide church lead-

ers and members with the resources needed to create spiritual growth," Huffard said, "then we can prevent churches from being paralyzed by seemingly unresolvable problems. We can help them manage conflict and keep the vision of their congregation alive."

Governor presents award to American Studies Institute

THE MUCH-AWARDED AMERICAN Studies Institute has received another honor — the Citizenship Award from the Freedoms Foundation of Valley Forge, Pa.

It was presented Jan. 30 by Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee prior to his appearance as part of the American Studies Institute Distinguished Lecture Series.

"This program is a credit to the state of Arkansas, and I have admired it for some time," Governor Huckabee said. "I know it is probably the envy of public and private campuses across the nation, and it is my distinct privilege to present President Burks with this award."

The award, given in the category of programs and activities, is the ninth earned by the Institute. Recipients are chosen based on the merits of patriotism, humanitarianism, social responsibility, government and heritage displayed in the institution's programs.

Harding has a long-standing tradition of recognition from the Freedoms Foundation. The American Studies Institute was recognized as the outstanding campus program in 1980 and has since received numerous awards in the area of community service. Either the program itself or faculty and administration at the University have won a Freedoms Foundation award every year for the past 43 years.

Winter graduation continues record-setting pace

COMMENCEMENT CEREMONIES Dec. 21 marked the third consecutive time a record number of students received diplomas.

May, August and December graduation ceremonies in 1996 were each record-setting groups with nearly 800 students graduating.

According to the Registrar's Office, 413 students graduated in May, August totaled 155, and 222 students graduated in December. Each of the figures surpassed the respective total for the previous year.

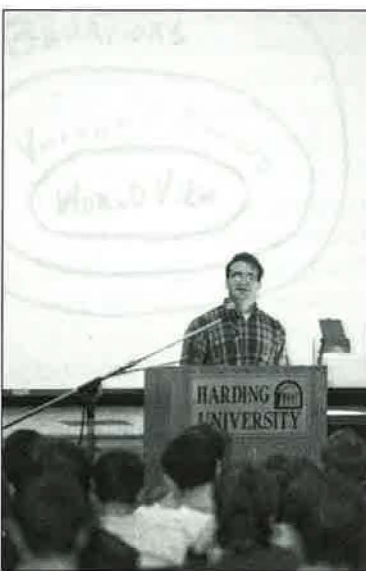
Speaking at December graduation was Marquita Moss, executive director of Brentwood Christian School in Austin, Texas. More than 70 of the 222 students were honor graduates, which requires a grade point average of 3.30 or higher. Sixteen students achieved the highest honors level of summa cum laude.

Winning basketball seasons climaxed by Lady Bisons' berth in national tourney

HARDING'S BASKETBALL SEASONS could best be described by "one made it; one didn't."

Both teams were vying to make return trips to the NAIA national tournaments. On the strength of a record-setting 25-3 record, the Lady Bisons received an at-large berth in the women's tournament held March 19-24 at Jackson, Tenn.

The Bisons saw their season end with a 66-64 loss to Ouachita Baptist University in the first round of the NAIA Southwest Regional Tournament in Fort Worth, Texas. They finished the season at 17-11, marking the first time the men's team had put together three consecutive winning seasons.

Led by seniors Angie Dugger and Bridget Benson, the Lady Bisons eclipsed their previous record of 24 season victories set last year. Dugger, a two-time NAIA All-American, scored at a record pace of 22.8 points per game while pulling down 10.3 rebounds. During the regular season, Dugger established three scoring marks: a single game high of 40 points, 686 points for the season, and a career total of 2,504.

Benson, a two-time All Southwest Region selection, was a defensive specialist, guarding the opposing team's top scorer. Her steals and blocked shots led a stingy defense that held opponents to 62 points per game. She scored 10.7 points per game.

Others playing major roles in the record-setting season were junior Mandy Cox, sophomores Molly McPherson and Emily Prysock, and freshman Rachel Raglin. Prysock led the region in assists, and Cox shot almost 50 percent from three-point range.

Lack of a big man in the mid-

dle proved to be the Achilles' heel for the Bisons during the season. After a rocky 4-5 start, the team improved in the last half of the season, winning key road games at Ouachita Baptist University and Lyon College.

Junior Carlton Bryant averaged more than 18 points per game. Junior J.R. Duke led the team in all shooting percentages and ranked third in NAIA three-point shooting, connecting on 52 percent of his shots.

Junior guards Matt Daniel and

Clif Miller played key roles in the team's successful season. Daniel led the region in assists, and Miller was the squad's number three scorer.

Lone senior Calvin Bowens had knee surgery after the first game and received a medical waiver. He will be back for his final season next year, bolstering the team's offensive attack.

Both the men's and women's teams will compete in the Lone Star Conference next year as Harding moves into NCAA Division II competition.

First-year coach Fullerton guiding baseball team

SIX RETURNING STARTERS, A SOLID crop of newcomers, and an experienced pitching staff provide the nucleus for the 1997 baseball team led by first-year coach Shane Fullerton.

Tim Laceyfield heads the Bison pitching staff along with Josh Moore, Bentley Harrell and Jeremy Pharr.

Six returning position starters include Pat and Ronnie Lightfoot at shortstop and second base, outfielders Jeremy and Shane Pharr, first baseman Ryan Rana, and Ryan Tharp who will compete for a spot at third base with David Rampey. In addition to the returning players, the Bisons are also looking to transfers Josh Bostic in the outfield, catcher Jeff Hernandez, and pitcher Aaron Brister to give them a great deal of production, experience and leadership.

The 1997 season is the Bison's first to compete against Lone Star Conference teams. Although official conference play will not begin until the spring of 1998, the Bisons have scheduled each team in the competitive Northern Division of the NCAA Division II league. The schedule also includes NCAA II power Central Missouri State and Division III powerhouse University of Wisconsin/Oshkosh. The Bison's post-season hopes will rest on their performance against Arkansas NAIA foes Lyon College, Ouachita Baptist University, Arkansas Tech University and the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff.

Williams, Wood head Bison golfers

THE BISON GOLF TEAM GOES INTO its first season of Lone Star Conference play under the direction of coach Nicky Boyd.

Two of Harding's all-time best

players, Brad Williams and Brad Wood, lead the team in their senior year. Both players have been all-conference and tournament leaders consistently during their careers.

The senior duo are joined by three newcomers, Stephen Bell, Bill Brandsma and David Pero, who have demonstrated the ability to play well during fall matches. Bryan Layton is also vying for a slot.

The Lone Star Conference will be a special challenge as a number of teams are nationally competitive. Coach Boyd feels that a good season could make the Bisons a solid contender for the NAIA play-offs in Harding's final year of membership in the organization.

Tennis players face tough competition in Lone Star

OFTEN CHAMPIONS AND ALWAYS A contender in the AIC, the men's and women's tennis teams are now in the hot bed of NCAA Division II tennis in the Lone Star Conference.

On the men's side, Abilene Christian, Central Oklahoma and West Texas were all in the top 10 last year along with highly-ranked NAIA teams Ouachita Baptist and Northeastern Oklahoma, making for a strong conference.

The women are competing against national runner-up Abilene Christian, top 10 Central Oklahoma and Northeastern Oklahoma, number seven in last year's NAIA championship.

All-Americans Arturo Rodriguez, Guillermo Hernandez and Claudia Cordera return as proven, top players. Rodriguez ranks high among Harding's all-time great players, and Hernandez is strong at both doubles and singles. Cordera, in her senior year, has moved up to number two singles.

Andrew Garner, Darren Wade, Nathaniel Israel and Juan Hernandez round out the men's top six.

Julie Gil transferred in from Laredo Junior College to play

number one singles. Other top women include Yessica Sanchez, Christina Rodriguez, Claudia Navarro and Shelly Schaefer.

Track teams prepare for strong show in conference

A SMALL PIECE OF THE ATLANTA Olympics is represented on the track team in Calister Ubah. Ubah, running for her native country Nigeria, competed in both the 200 meters and the 400-meter relay last summer. At the Arkansas, Kansas and Oklahoma meets in preparation for the NAIA National meet Feb. 27-28 in Lincoln, Neb., she won either the 55 meter or 200 meter events.

Ericka Harris, junior transfer Bumiegha Tombiri and Ubah form a trio of talented sprinters for the Lady Bisons. Distance runners Diane Grubbs, Kelly Lauterbach and Cheri Scharff all ran well in cross country for Coach Bryan Phillips. Good things seem to come in threes and the hurdles are no exception with Erin Elliott, Ashley Howard and Amy Wiley running the two-hurdle races. Overall depth, especially in field events, is missing, but Harding is well represented on the track.

All-Americans Tommy Noel and Jonah Tanui lead the way for the Bisons. Both ran on Harding's record-setting distance medley and two-mile relays indoors last year. In early indoor meets, transfer Albert Tabut has qualified for the NAIA meet in both the 800 and 1500 meters. Distance runners Seth Crum and Jonathan Dandy round out the experienced distance crew while lettermen Jermaine Cuffie and Conner Grimes are the sprinters.

Field event performers Grant Chism and Bryan Rampey started the season well as they both scored in indoor meets.

The Lone Star Conference track championship is at Tarleton State.



HE ATTENDED COLLEGE HERE. He taught here. He served as president here. He now serves as chancellor here. He even exchanged wedding vows here. Dr. Clifton L. Ganus Jr., who continues to play an important role in the development of this institution, has given the majority of his life to Harding. In honor of his 75th birthday this April and recognizing that he has reached the 50-year milestone of continuous service to the University, we interviewed Dr. Ganus to discover his thoughts and activities as chancellor over the past 10 years.

What are your official duties as the University's chancellor?

At Harding, the president serves as chief executive officer in the administration, and the chancellor functions as a staff member. The chancellor is not over the vice president, the deans or anyone else, but is responsible for whatever areas the president or board of directors assigns to him. In my case, I'm involved in public relations, fund raising and student recruitment. I represent Harding in any way necessary, and from time to time, I am assigned special projects by the president. I don't work with the nitty gritty or the daily grind, that's the president's responsibility, but I am involved with those three areas and any other way I can be of assistance.

Your wife, Louise, has been actively involved with many activities and organizations. What has she been involved with recently?

She is mainly involved with Associated Women for Harding. She sponsored a social club for many years, but is no longer doing that.

You now have three grandchildren at the University, and four grandchildren at the Academy. How does it feel to see your grandchildren taking an active part in the school you spent much of your life building?

It's wonderful to be able to see them grow, mature and become involved with good activities. I enjoy watching John Richard Duke play basketball. Because his younger

brother, David, hurt his knee, he couldn't play this past season. Hopefully we can watch him next year. John Richard will be a senior next year, so maybe the two brothers will play together again. We also enjoy watching dramatic and musical presentations that the grandchildren are involved in. It is gratifying to see them contribute to the work at Harding in one way or another. My wife and I enjoyed Harding very much as students, and we would like to see our grandchildren have the same experience.

You have traveled extensively throughout the world. Is there a common trait among the people you have met during your travels?

I've been in 103 countries that I can remember, and in some respects there's a tremendous amount of difference in people, civilizations and societies. However, it does not matter whether you're in the darkest parts of London, England, or Buenos Aires, Argentina; people are basically the same. They have the same needs and wants in life. They need air to breathe, food to eat, clothes to wear and houses to live in. Of course, those houses may differ from mud huts to mansions, but you must have those things in order to survive. The people I've met still have the same love, hate and desires that are found around the world. There's the same need for God and the same struggle against evil and unrighteousness. These traits are found everywhere, whether it's the United States, India or China, the common thread of Christ — Christianity — is a very interesting tie that binds us all together. It doesn't matter whether I'm in Australia, Africa or anywhere, being with brethren is a great thrill. It's wonderful to watch young Christians grow regardless of



what society they're in, and I enjoy seeing them mature and reach out to teach others.

An example of these basic similarities comes from our mission in the Ukraine. We've worked three years with the church over there, and we helped convert a number of people, four of whom are now preaching. Just like the United States, in the Ukraine you see young men grow in the spirit and preach to others. There are great differences in all the countries and societies, but at the same time, there is a common thread of human and spiritual needs that ties us all together to make us one flesh and one spirit when we become children of God.

I read an article recently from a bulletin. The article, entitled "Who has it better?," used a difference between African culture and U.S. culture to show how one is not necessarily better than another. People in Africa have to walk several miles to church. In the United States, we drive three blocks to church, then after dinner, walk four miles in the park to keep fit. I did this myself this past Sunday. Now who has it better? Because every society has their positives and negatives, you can't really call one more advantageous than the other. Over there, the concern is finding

enough food to eat. Over here, the concern is whether you're eating too much. In spite of many cultural differences, we perceive the same inclinations, wants, desires, love for family and hate that people in other countries experience.

Last spring, you were recognized for giving Harding 50 years of service. What's motivated you to stay at Harding?

Where else would I go? Where else would I go to do more good for young people and others, to enjoy spiritual values and to have the love and care of people I've known for a long time?

Where would I go for a better situation? I don't know. People ask me where I'm going after I leave Harding, and I say "heaven." I could not find a better place to give of myself and help others, and at the same time receive from others the encouragement which I need. When you've been at a place this long, it's home. For example, look at an elderly person moving to a nursing home. They want to stay in their home. They fight to stay in their home. We experienced this when Louise and I had to put my mother-in-law in a nursing home. She didn't want to go, but we had no other choice because she required 24-hour care. To me, to go somewhere else would be like putting me in a nursing home. Here is where my roots are and where I have been so blessed and hopefully have been able to bless others. Harding is my home.

As student, teacher, president and now chancellor, Dr. Ganus has labored to help build this University into the strong institution it is today. Well into his 51st year with Harding, he continues to give of himself daily to the students, faculty and staff, strengthening the tie that binds him to the hearts of the Harding community. *HL*

SEARCHING FOR THE TRUTH

Jerry "Boo" Mitchell's investigative reporting helped reopen the Medgar Evers case documented in Rob Reiner's recent film "Ghosts of Mississippi"

HOW CAN ONE BE both a journalist and a Christian? 1982 Harding graduate Jerry "Boo" Mitchell has thought out his answer to this often-posed question: "In a lot of ways, we're both truth-seekers," he replies.

Mitchell's most renowned trail for truth led to a series of exposés concerning a 30-year-old murder case, dramatized in the newly-released Rob Reiner film "Ghosts of Mississippi." He said he is flattered by the praise, but humbled by all that has become of his 1989 truth-finding mission in a Jackson courthouse.

"I was just doing my job," Mitchell says of his role in exposing evidence that eventually reopened the case of Medgar Evers, a civil rights activist who was gunned down at his home in June 1963. Ku Klux Klan member Byron De La Beckwith was arrested in the murder that same month, but two trials ended in hung juries and set De La Beckwith free.

Mitchell's job as Jackson court reporter in 1989 found him researching a story about a long-dead segregationist group, the Mississippi Sovereignty Commission, whose files were sealed by state legislature until the year 2027. "I got an anonymous tip about some Commission papers being accidentally filed in the court file," Mitchell said, understanding that the mistake put

top-secret documents in public view.

"I'm looking at all these papers that have 'confidential' stamped across them," he said, laughing at the excitement of the moment he found the file. "I slipped down the hall and made photocopies." Those four secret papers showed that the state had infiltrated and stolen files from civil rights organizations in Jackson.

More than that, perhaps, the papers incited Mitchell's unquenchable competitive nature. "It was a challenge and I was deter-

mined to see it through," he said. "I hate to lose. I've always hated to lose."

Mitchell's drive for victory combined with what he calls "a divine hand" after Jackson's *The Clarion-Ledger* ran its first article about the commission to a mixed community reaction. "I'd like to say (support) was instantaneous, but a lot of people were upset," he said.

Sources began to leak documents that revealed commission agents had investigated prospective jurors in De La Beckwith's trial. "The State was secretly helping the defense," he said simply.

Soon, Mitchell phoned Evers' widow, Myrlie, who joined forces with Jackson's then-assistant district attorney, Bobby DeLaughter, to get the case reopened. "It was a million-to-one chance," Mitchell said of the reopening. "There were prayers, and there were so many things that happened, so many pieces of evidence that were missing that just showed up suddenly."

Evidence led to a third trial which landed De La Beckwith in prison for life on Feb. 5, 1994. Appeal is pending, according to Mitchell.

DeLaughter, portrayed in the movie by Alec Baldwin, and Myrlie Evers, played by Whoopi Goldberg, are the focus of the films' action, which addresses in part DeLaughter's own subdued prejudices.

Mitchell, who was raised in Texarkana, Texas, admits that the subtle prejudice De-Laughter had to overcome is often ingrained in the Southern mind. "When I grew up, it seemed like the civil rights movement took place on some other planet," he said. Schools were integrated when he was in the fifth grade, but "it wasn't traumatic," he said.

Mitchell's Christian upbringing left no room for the prejudice of his world. "My parents always said that we all need to learn to live together," he said.

But, the self-searching in this intense case unveiled for Mitchell the need to live out his heart-felt beliefs, not to be "isolated and cocooned" from other races.

The implications of the victorious case of Medgar Evers overflow from those immediately involved, into the church, and then into the world, according to Mitchell.

He spoke with enthusiasm about the fully integrated church. "There's no segregation in heaven," he said, pointing out that "beyond this case and all of this are our relationships with other humans."

This relationship lies at the heart of the gospel, and at the heart of what Mitchell is trying to do as a husband and father of

knowledge that his children, Katherine, 11, and Sam, 6, "learn so much by watching what we do." He and his wife, Karen (formerly Karen O'Donaghy), met at Harding and now live in Columbus, Ohio, where Mitchell works on a Kiplinger Fellowship to complete a book about his "long journey" for justice in the Evers case.

He quickly acknowledges that this case, this movie, and his book do not signify an end to racial problems in the South, quoting a line in the movie, "This is

just one small step."

But Mitchell is excited about the progress, and anticipates a future in which "color barriers" will be broken. "Race will be the dominant issue in the next century," he said, expressing the truth-seeker's hope "that we can get beyond race and deal with other issues." **III**

DOWN UNDER

THE UNIVERSITY'S OVERSEAS CAMPUS
IN BRISBANE, AUSTRALIA, WELCOMES
ITS FIRST GROUP OF STUDENTS

THE LAND "DOWN UNDER" became home this fall to Harding's newest international studies program — Harding University in Australia (HUA).

Australia is a mystical land, home to koalas, kangaroos and duck-billed platypus, all animals found nowhere else on earth. It is the smallest continent, but the largest island.

Unlike the University's programs in Italy, England or Greece, where students see majestic architecture, learn about America's mother country or walk through relics from biblical times, Australia offers participants a chance to live with koalas in their backyard and glimpse the pure, natural beauty and unspoiled splendor of God's creation.

Australia displays God's handiwork in its contrasting landscapes. The aqua-blue oceans, with brightly-colored tropical fish and expansive coral reefs, contrast with both the golden bareness of the Outback and the lush greenery of the tropical rain forest hidden in the continent's interior.

A trip to the rain forest exposed the differences between the vegetation of this new land and that of the United States. Though in the dry season, the rain forest was green and beautiful. We took a guided tour of the forest and then went for a walk along the tops of trees. "Walking on the tree-top walk and looking out at the mountains around me was like being on top of the world, but down under. It was cool," sophomore Amanda Dombrowski said.

In September we embarked on a two-week trip that included stops at the Great Barrier Reef,

Kakadu National Park, Ayers Rock and Ooraminna Bush Camp. At the Great Barrier Reef, we had the opportunity to snorkel and dive.

For many this was the first glimpse into a clean, untouched ocean. Fish and turtles swam freely in the clear water as they looked for their morning meal, seemingly unfazed by the students fighting the current to take pictures of the fish and coral with underwater cameras. "This program revealed to me why the Great Barrier Reef is one of the seven natural wonders of the world. It was spectacular," Sheri Potter, a junior from Sarasota, Fla., said.

In Kakadu National Park (an Aboriginal reserve), we took a sunset crocodile cruise, watching many of Australia's inhabitants in their natural environment. One of the most unusual sights I saw was the brumbys (wild horses) grazing on an interior island.

At Ayers Rock we watched the sunset. The next day we set out to climb it. At the top I looked out across the barrenness and saw a dark gray, storm-cloud mass that had been circling the area. Standing so close to a thunderstorm was a humbling experience. The intensity of the moment, combined with fear inspired by the storm, demonstrated the power, love and protectiveness of God.

During the two-week excursion, we were surprised with a night "under the stars." Sleeping "under the stars" is the polite way of saying camping in swags (sleeping bags) on the ground

out in the middle of nowhere. After the outdoor experience, we began to explore Ooraminna Bush Camp.

At the camp we built a bonfire where we held the most uplifting devotional I had experienced in Australia. Being with friends in a desert far from civilization and singing praises to God was an experience like no other. This may have been what life was like for the Israelites when wandering in the desert for 40 years. They had to rely on God as no one else was there to help them.



HUA OFFERS THE OPPORTUNITY to witness the country's beauty, get to know the local residents and learn about the land. Most of the Aussies we met were extremely friendly and proud of their country. Though they may complain about its problems, they would not live anywhere else on earth.

This program changes the way participants look at their entire world, from the squirrels scurrying around campus to the pine trees on the interstates to their spirituality. When reflecting on memories of crystal blue oceans, lush rain forests, angry thunderheads and star-scattered nights, I know that I have witnessed God through all the natural beauties of Australia. H

In 1996 more than 600 Harding faculty, students and staff participated in mission campaigns in 29 countries on six continents. From health clinics in Africa to fishing villages in Scotland to the Outback of Australia to the barrios of South America to orphanages in Romania to the inner city of Chicago — all were witness to the difference Harding makes in the lives of people. Closer to home, an imaginative and creative project captured the enthusiasm of the student body. In November, student leaders orchestrated a statewide food drive called "Feed Arkansas," which netted more than seven tons of food and involved more than 1,000 students from 18 Arkansas colleges and universities. These projects are only two of the dozens of services which Harding students provided for those in need. ❖ One of the most significant campus events in 1996 was the 37th annual World Missions Workshop which brought to campus 1,500 students from colleges nationwide. In addition, more than 700 Harding students participated in the four-day event in October. By the end of the workshop, more than 400 students had made commitments to world evangelism. ❖ The Student Association in 1996 received the worldwide support of

alumni, friends and parents. It was not a major fundraising project; instead, 800 individuals volunteered to pray 10 minutes per week for the success of the work being done at Harding. ❖ Through both tradition and commitment, Harding provides a quality education where excellence is the standard for measuring performance. Academic programs in 1996 enhanced the distinctiveness of the Harding experience. The School of Nursing was granted an eight-year reaccreditation by the National League for Nursing. The School of Education was granted a five-year reaccreditation by the National Council for

Accreditation of Teacher Education. ❖ One unique strength of Harding's curriculum is the diversity of its international studies program. In 1996 that program added a semester of study in Australia to its already diverse offerings in England, Italy and Greece. Twenty-five students and two faculty members used Brisbane as their home base for 16 educational tours throughout the continent and a 12-day Outback safari. ❖ Another addition to the curriculum in late 1996 thrust Harding again to the forefront among universities affiliated with churches of Christ. A 36-hour major in criminal justice was approved by the faculty and will be jointly offered by the political science and behavioral science departments. The new

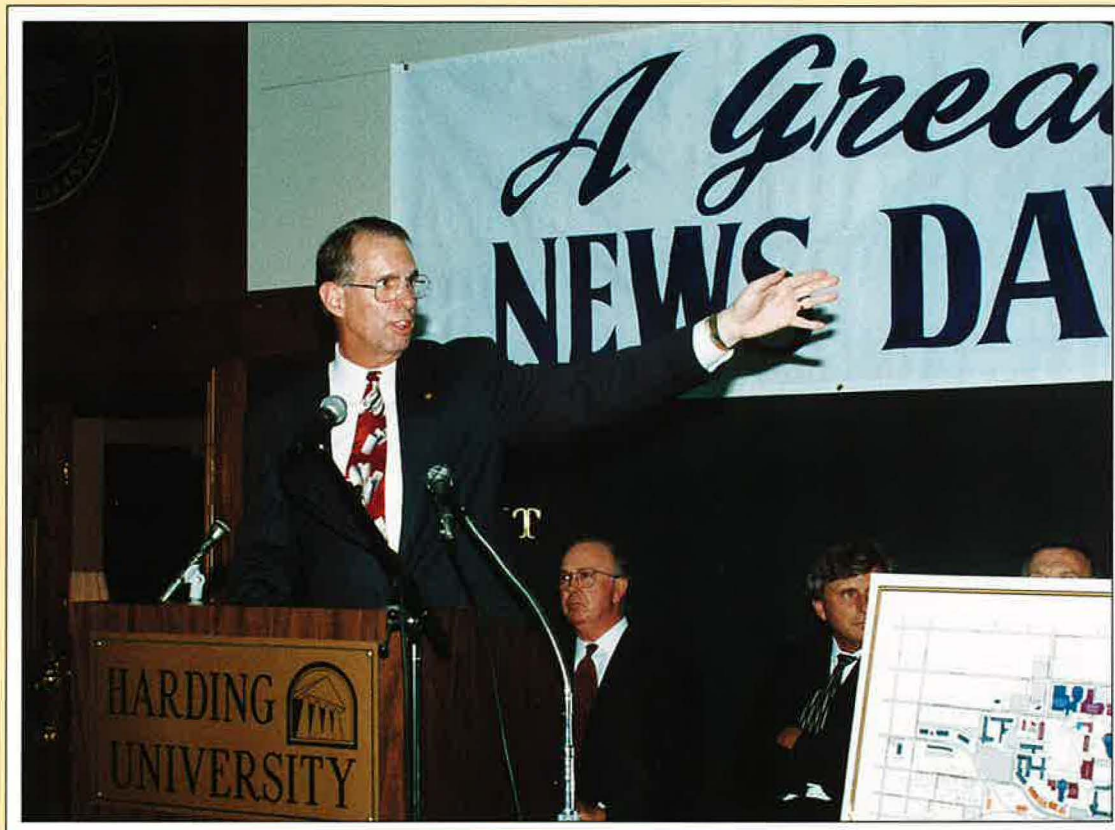
earned doctorates or terminal degrees in their respective fields of study. A strong faculty enhances Harding's standing in various rankings of institutions — rankings students and parents review when making decisions about college enrollment.

❖ A strong faculty and curriculum affect the number and quality of students who apply for admission and ultimately enroll. For the ninth consecutive year, Harding's enrollment reached record heights. Total University enrollment hit 4,088, including more than 50 Merit Scholars. The record total included 200 at the Graduate School of Religion in Memphis, Tenn. The increase included 1,105 new students. The record enrollment reflects

the confidence both parents and students have in the educational programs at Harding. In the last decade, Harding's enrollment has grown 34 percent from

3,046 to 4,088. ❖ Part of Harding's uniqueness comes from its ability to maximize its resources and provide state-of-the-art facilities for its students. During 1996, two major projects were completed and a third will begin in 1997. The \$800,000 renovation of the Olen Hendrix Building provided a complete modernization of the building housing the School of Nursing and the department of family and consumer sciences. In August, Searcy Hall, the University's next generation of campus housing, was opened for use. The \$4 million apartment facility reflects new attitudes toward housing on campuses nationwide. Earlier in July, the Donald W. Reynolds Foundation announced a \$5.9 million grant to Harding for the construction of a 50,000-square-foot music and communication center. The facility is expected to be completed by the beginning of the 1998 fall semester and Harding's 75th anniversary year. ❖ Another distinctive characteristic is the generosity of Harding's supportive constituencies, support that has helped keep tuition to a minimum and affordability at a maximum. Harding relies heavily on its constituencies to meet its day-to-day operating expenses as well as providing a sound financial base

for the future. In 1996 the University received more than \$7.6 million in gifts from 6,868 donors. The total of gifts was the third best in the school's history. Included in that total was a record \$3.18 million in gifts from alumni, the seventh consecutive year that alumni donations topped the \$1 million mark. Also included in the \$7.6 million were gifts totaling more than \$1 million each from foundations and the board of trustees. During 1996, \$1.9 million was raised toward the annual operating fund, which makes up the difference between actual student costs and the amount students pay for tuition and fees; \$1.7 million was raised in capital fund gifts for new building projects and renovations; and \$2.3 million was given for endowment and deferred or restricted gifts, which are all designated for specific purposes and are not for general use by the University. With two years remaining in the "Dream Continues" Campaign, the University has secured \$51.4 million in gifts and pledges toward the goal of \$58.2 million. H

Record alumni giving reaches nearly \$3.2 million

THE "DREAM CONTINUES," THE UNIVERSITY'S five-year campaign, completed its first 42 months Dec. 31, 1996. With 70 percent of the time elapsed in this effort, the University continues to be blessed by gifts and pledges from numerous support groups, including trustees, President's Council, alumni, foundations, churches, businesses and other friends.

Gifts and pledges during 1996 reached \$7,694,696, surpassed only by years one and two of the campaign. This amount elevated the total gifts and pledges in the "Dream" to \$51,426,486. These gifts came from 6,866 individual donors through more than 18,800 separate gifts.

In June of 1996 the Donald W. Reynolds Foundation announced that it

would make a grant to be used for the cost of constructing and furnishing an academic building to house the departments of music and communications. With that gift came a challenge to Harding to raise \$1.2 million to endow the facility. Because of this extraordinary gift, the "Dream Continues" goal was adjusted upward from \$52 million to \$58.2 million.

Several bright spots appear in a review of the year's giving. Alumni giving from 5,661 donors reached a record level of nearly \$3.2 million. An outstanding year for planned gifts yielded \$1.75 million in gifts from 12 donors. Churches making gifts resulted in \$346,858, with two gifts totaling \$150,000 and funding scholarships at Harding's Graduate School of Religion.

Trustee giving topped the \$1 million mark while the President's Council reached \$784,829.

Continuing to be the University's chief annual challenge, the Harding University Scholarship Fund needs well over \$2 million annually to meet the financial assistance needs of students. While many people like to give restricted gifts, more and more people are needed who will "restrict" their gifts to annual scholarship needs.

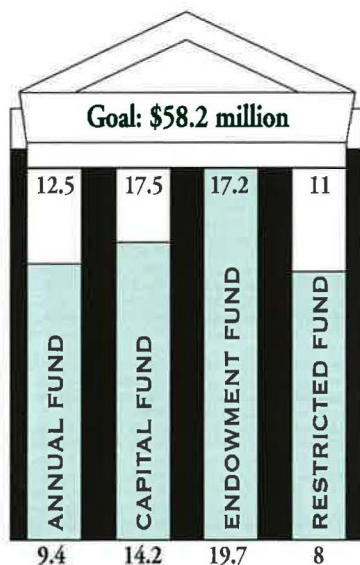

Companies participating in matching gift programs set their own ratios of giving. Most of them match 1:1 — one dollar for each dollar given by an employee to his or her alma mater, up to a certain limit. Others match 1:2, 1:3, 1:4 — even up to 1:9.

If you know that you work for a matching gift company, why not plan a gift to Harding? All you have to do is go by your company's personnel office to request a matching gift form. Simply fill the form out, send it to Harding along with your personal gift, and we will then notify your employer. If all eligibility requirements are met, your company will then match your gift, multiplying your giving power.

IN FEBRUARY 1983, KATHY GWEN HARKER died of aplastic anemia. A few months later, her father, Jack Harker, wanted to establish a memorial scholarship for nursing students in his only daughter's honor. A business acquaintance, who was an alumnus of Harding, suggested contacting the University to set up the scholarship.

Neither Jack nor his daughter had ties to Harding. However, Kathy had been a nurse until her death and had devoted her career to serving others. Jack saw that Harding promotes service to other individuals and chose the University's nursing students to receive scholarship funds as a memorial to his only child.

This past year, Jack died and honored Harding with almost \$70,000 from his estate. The scholarship fund, which began by awarding \$500 a year, will now offer close to \$5,000 a year.

Because an alumnus mentioned Harding to a prospective donor, a father kept his daughter's memory alive, and students received help continuing their path in service to others.

Betty Clark Goyne (BA'59)

Creating an "All-American" city

Located on 11 square miles not far from Disney Land is the California city of Westminster — "The City of Progress Built on Pride." It is the envy of many cities across the nation because of the top honor it received as the 1996 All-American City.

Alumna Betty Clark Goyne, who graduated with an elementary education degree in 1959, has done her fair share of upholding the city's motto. In fact, it is a program she developed five years ago that ultimately led to the national honor, awarded each year by the National Civic League.

Goyne works for the city as the director of its senior citizens center. It's a line of work she entered following a career change at the age of 40. After 12 years in public education, Goyne pursued and obtained a degree in gerontology from Pepperdine University.

"I've had some neat life experiences working with both age groups," Goyne said. Not for a minute does she regret the job change.

But Goyne received a daily reminder that she could still have an impact on children's

lives. Each afternoon outside her office window she saw more than 200 school children wandering unsupervised through the grounds of a low-income apartment building.

"I saw them getting into gangs and other activities, and I knew something had to be done," Goyne said. Instead of overlooking the problem, she took it upon herself to help solve it.

She developed a program called Project SHUE (Safety, Health, Understanding and Education) that seeks to intermingle the residents of the senior citizens center with the children of the apartment facility.

"Most of the children are either Vietnamese or Hispanic and have parents who do not speak English," Goyne said. "This program was designed to open up the senior center after school so that the children could have help on their homework from senior adults." At the same time it provides the children a safe environment in which to socialize and enjoy the company of senior citizens.

Goyne took her program before the city council for ap-

proval and funding. "They loved the idea," Goyne said, "but they had no money to fund it."

That did not deter Goyne. She promptly began to write grants hoping to receive funding from an outside source. Grant writing was a new endeavor for her, but she wrote more than 180 such documents.

The work paid off when Hitachi Corporation provided an \$80,000 grant. Other foundations soon followed, and Goyne had her program — now fully funded — ready to launch.

It became an immediate success. The city council was so impressed by the project it wanted Goyne to pursue the possibility of entering Westminster into the "All-American City" contest, a highly competitive event in which only 30 cities are chosen as finalists each year. Goyne organized and led the three-month-long effort on behalf of Westminster.

"It was the most difficult thing I have ever done because the entire venture had to be generated with community support through volunteers," Goyne said.

She found herself having to unite Vietnamese, Hispanic and Caucasian factions among city residents. "I had to make them gel all their efforts in a positive way. I did a lot of praying, and God knew how scared I was and that I was really out of my league," she said.

But the efforts paid off. After receiving first runner-up in 1995, Westminster was named the winner of the 1996 competition held in Fort Worth, Texas. And after 17 years as a city employee, Goyne was named Westminster's 1996 Citizen of the Year.

With the hard work and excitement behind her, Goyne is now focusing on the continued success of Project SHUE and continuing to maintain a strong, viable senior citizens center for Westminster.

"I love my work, and it has become my ministry. I daily see God's hand in what I'm doing," she says with pride — a great pride that has helped Westminster firmly uphold its city motto. ■

FOCUS ON THE FUTURE

The stock answer is often the best answer

JACK "CASH" BROWN RECEIVES A LETTER from Harding University urging him to provide financial support for the ongoing work of the University. Being the generous man that he is, Jack immediately pulls out his checkbook and writes a check for \$10,000. He thinks to himself, I'll not only help Harding, I'll receive a nice income tax charitable deduction as well.

Jack's friend, Jill "Appreciation" Smith, also receives the same letter from Harding. However, instead of writing a check, she calls her stockbroker for an update on her portfolio. She learns one of her publicly traded stocks, XYZ Company, has appreciated significantly from when she bought it two years ago for \$10 per share. It is now trading at \$20. And since she owns 500 shares, she has an appreciated asset worth \$10,000 — twice what she paid for it.

Jill has a decision to make. Should she tell the broker to sell the stock and

send her a check in the mail (which she would then use to make a gift to Harding), or have the broker transfer the stock to Harding's account? In other words, should she give cash or stock to Harding? Jill chose the stock answer.

"I want to make a gift of this stock to Harding," she says. "I will send you written authorization. I'll also send a note to Harding's planned gifts officer about the gift."

Consider the wisdom shown in Jill's decision. Instead of selling the stock, paying the required 28% capital gains tax on the appreciation and giving what's left to Harding, she makes a direct gift of the stock. In so doing, she bypasses the capital gains tax entirely. She knows that Harding is a qualified charitable organization and has learned we can sell the stock without the same tax consequences she would experience.

Let's take an even closer look. Jill paid \$5,000 for the stock. However, she

receives an income tax charitable deduction for a gift of \$10,000. And since, like Jack, she is in the 33% income tax bracket, she will save \$3,300 in taxes — assuming, of course, she is able to use all the deduction.

In short, it costs Jack \$6,700 to make a gift of \$10,000 (\$10,000 less \$3,300 income tax savings), while it costs Jill only \$5,300 (\$10,000 less \$1,400 capital gains savings less \$3,300 income tax savings).
