## Dedication Honors Brackett Family

"A dream come true" was the description of the \$1.8 million Brackett Library as it was dedicated October 15 by President David B. Burks.

The newest addition to the university's academic program is named for Mr. and Mrs. Robert L. Brackett of Vero Beach, Fla., who gave \$1.6 million toward the construction of the facility. The gift was the largest single gift ever made to Harding.

More than 500 faculty, students and community leaders were present for the dedication. Eighteen members of the Brackett family were also present for the event.

Calling the new facility the "most important facet of our academic program," Burks thanked the Bracketts for their generosity in helping make the library project become a reality. Burks praised the library staff for designing a functional library that "not only satisfies our needs now, but also gives us room to grow."

The construction of the new library was one of the goals announced three years ago when Burks and the board of trustees launched the \$25 million Beyond Excellence campaign. The campaign is a five-year drive scheduled to be completed in 1992.

Speaking for members of the family, Brackett said, "This project was important to us because it was so important to the faculty and

students at Harding. The library serves every area of the academic community and it is fundamental to Harding's goal of excellence. We are so happy to have been able to be a part of the project."

Two of the Brackett's five children have attended Harding. Danny is currently a sophomore. Sue (Mrs. Tim) Dean is a 1988 alumna. Their other children are Robert, Glenda (Mrs. Joe) Wild and Marta (Mrs. Lee) Pickerill, all residents of Vero Beach. All five children and their families were present for the dedication.

Following the dedication the Brackett family was honored at a dinner attended by administrators and members of the library staff. At the dinner Brackett introduced each member of the family and son, Robert, presented his parents with a plaque from all the children commemorating the dedication.

Floyd Daniel, vice president of university relations, gave the Bracketts an original watercolor Harding scene painted by Tim Hacker, a Memphis dentist and Harding alumnus.

Construction on the 43,432 square foot facility started at the end of the 1989 spring semester and was completed by the beginning of the fall semester of 1990.

The library boasts more than five miles of shelves. Library director Suzanne Spurrier expects to add

## Duke Researcher Receives Alumni Award

Robert H. Jones, M.D., could not be on campus Oct. 27 to receive his award as Distinguished Alumnus of 1990. Instead, he was on a speaking engagement in Caracas, Venezuela, which is typical for his schedule.

He did make it to Searcy on Oct. 30 as a part of the American Studies Institute Distinguished Lecture Series, where he received the honor. In addition, he addressed the student body.

Only two weeks earlier, he had become the first American ever to be named to the Academy of Cardiac Science of Poland.

The endless listings of accomplishments and awards

that have come to Bob Jones since his graduation from Harding in 1961 are not surprising. As a student, the Hutchinson, Kansas, native was one of three National Merit Scholars to enter Harding in the freshman class in 1957. He served as junior class president and president of the Student Association, sang bass four years with the A Cappella Chorus, and had achieved membership in Alpha Chi, among other involvements, at graduation.

After he received a medical degree from Johns Hopkins University in 1965, he was a surgery intern at Duke University Medical

# Church Growth Researcher Joins Faculty

For years, Flavil Yeakley has been asking "Why and what can be done about it?" in matters of churches that are declining in growth. The author of *Why Churches Grow*, Yeakley joined the university faculty as a professor last fall to establish the Harding Center for Church Growth Studies. Currently he is putting together programs toward the development of the center, and he will continue to develop and conduct seminars on growth, leadership and related topics for churches.

Yeakley's interest and experience in the subject began seriously in the 1960's when there was a noticeable decline in the growth rate of Churches of Christ. With the assistance

of fellow researcher Mac Lynn, he gathered data for a study on what could be done. "Since there was no headquarters, or no research base to work from, we had no statistics collected from which to learn what was happening," he said.

Involvement with the North American Society for Church Growth has afforded opportunity for valuable information and method for the cause. Recently Yeakley was elected 2nd Vice President of the Society, which he will serve as president in 1992. He is the first representative from the Church of Christ to hold an office in the organization for church growth teachers, researchers, writers, consultants representing many

religious groups who have an interest in church growth.

In 1974, Yeakley moved to Tulsa to begin a ten-year work, continuing to investigate and collect data related to his quest. Through the years, his findings were grim, with a membership decline noted in the first half of the '80s. The 1981 rate of loss was .033 percent; 1983 showed a full percent. "Had that trend continued," he said, "it meant that churches would be losing 15 percent of their membership by the end of the eighties."

Figures from the annual surveys attracted attention, but Yeakley felt that reporting numbers was only one step. The reasons were more compelling.

Fortunately, by 1985 the tabulations showed no growth, but, more positively, no decline. In 1986, membership grew by a half percent and in 1987, the records showed a full one percent advance. "It was good news to know that the decline has stopped. At that rate, 1990 could be 2½ percent more than the eighties," he said.

Plans include an opinion research, investigating what people believe and exploring what questions to ask. Part of the program will be an emphasis on encouraging students to pursue a second major in Bible. The



idea endorsed by the university is to develop graduates who can move to a locality prepared for a vocation and also prepared to serve, strengthen or perhaps even establish churches in their locale. One of the immediate needs, he said, is volunteers

who will get involved in finding out what the data means.

In addition to his teaching duties at Harding, the director will be available for three or four seminars each year for congregations or areas interesting in assisting with the research.

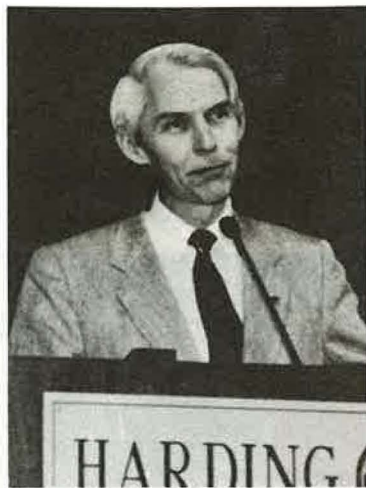
He is on the Board of Medical Examiners for the State of North Carolina, the American Board of Surgery, and the American Board of Thoracic Surgery.

A prolific researcher, he has served as principal investigator to administer grants totalling in the millions, such as a \$1,494,000 award from the National Institute of Health Bypass Angioplasty Revascularization Investigation (BARI) currently underway. In August of 1989, he was awarded a Duke/DuPont Research Program grant on "The Relationship between Myocardial Ischemia, Perfusion, Metabolism, and Cardiac Damage."

In 1988, he was named an Outstanding Alumnus of the College of Arts and Sciences. Last May, Jones became the third recipient of Alpha Chi Distinguished Alumnus award, the second Harding alumnus so honored. Dr. John Michael White of the University of Texas was the first honoree.

Mrs. Jones is the former Catherine Ann Peters, also a Harding graduate. They have three children — Julie Ann, Natalie Beth and David Bradley.

Jones serves as an elder in the Cole Mill Road Church of Christ in Durham.

7,000 volumes a year. Usage by faculty, students and Searcy residents has already topped the level of 1,000 individuals per day using the library and its resources.

Brackett Library contains more than 337,000 volumes, 1,300 current periodicals and is the depository for government documents.

An on-line catalog in conjunction with Data Research Associates provides the selection of materials through computerization. CD Rom indexing of five different indexing tools in the fields of business, education, nursing and general periodicals is also available.

Since 1984, the library has offered computer referencing for clientele through Bibliographic Resources, Inc. The library has been a selective depository for United States government publications and for Arkansas publications, with several hundred documents added to the collection annually.

## Librarians Attend Arkansas Meeting

## Title IV Grant Received

Harding has been selected to receive a \$120,000 grant from the federal government under the Title IV Student

Support Services program.

The grant will provide assistance to three categories of Harding students: (1) students from low income households; (2) first generation college students (neither parent holds a four-year college degree); and (3) physically handicapped students, including those students with diagnosed learning disabilities.

Support for these students will come in the form of specialized instruction, tutorial services, counseling, and assistance in securing information and financial aid for enrollment in graduate and professional schools.

Linda Thompson, director of student support services, will coordinate the grant activities. She will work with

Dee Bost, director of learning assistance programs, and Jenene Alexander, counselor and diagnostician.

Harding Graduate School of Religion will offer a course on the Searcy campus during the spring semester.

The course, "The Gospel of Mark," will be taught by Dr. Allen Black, assistant professor of New Testament.

The class will meet "bi-monthly" on Tuesday from 10 a.m. to 12 noon and from 1 p.m. to 4:45 p.m.

Dates for the class are Jan. 15, 29; Feb. 12, 26; March 26; and April 9 and 30.

## Tour Scheduled

The Harding University Chorus is making plans for Chorus Campaigns '92 in Europe, and alumni who have previously sung in any of the Harding choruses are invited to participate.

According to Dr. Cliff Ganus III, director of the Chorus, the four-week trip will include performances in Spain and Greece. The cost for each singer will be less than \$2,000.

All performances and local arrangements for Chorus Campaigns are made by local churches, and past campaigns have been effective in publicizing local congregations, developing new contacts, encouraging local Christians and introducing students to mission fields. The elders of the College Church of Christ direct evangelistic effort.

The trip will begin in mid-May or mid-June of 1992. Alumni who are interested in participating should contact Dr. Ganus as soon as possible for further information.

## Cole Receives Ph.D.

David Cole, an associate professor of chemistry, has successfully defended his Ph.D. dissertation entitled "Highway Deicing Salts and the Mobilization of Selected Heavy Metals from Stream Sediments." His research was a study of the effect of chloride ion concentration from road salt runoff on the concentration of cadmium, copper, lead, nickel and zinc in the water column and bound to sediments in a stream with a history of heavy metal pollution.

## Seminar Will Feature Minneapolis Executive



Harvey B. Mackay, author of the number one bestseller **Swim With the Sharks Without Being Eaten Alive**, will be the speaker for the management seminar to be held in the Benson Auditorium on March 21, 1991.

Mackay is chairman of the board and chief executive officer of Mackay Envelope Corporation in Minneapolis. He founded the company in 1959. The corporation employs 350 people and manufactures ten million envelopes per day.

**Swim With the Sharks Without Being Eaten Alive** was on the New York Times bestseller list for 54 weeks and was rated the number one business book in the United States for 1988. The book has been translated into 16 languages and distributed in 80 countries around the world.

His second book, **Beware The Naked Man Who Offers You His Shirt**, is Mackay's second New York Times number one bestseller in as many years.

Mackay has served as president of many organizations including the Envelope Manufacturers Association of America and the Greater Minneapolis Chamber of Commerce. He is director of the Chief Executives' Organization, Mount Sinai Hospital and Industry Square Development Corporation. Mackay is also national president of the University of Minnesota alumni association.

He has been a guest lecturer at many universities and business schools including Harvard, Cornell and Stamford. In 1981, Iowa Wesleyan College granted him an honorary doctor of laws degree, and in 1982 he was honored as volunteer of the year by the National Society of Fund Raising Executives.

Mackay was instrumental in attracting one of the nation's leading coaches, Lou Holtz, to the University of Minnesota football program, and recently he played a key role in bringing the 1992 Super Bowl to Minneapolis.

Harding's management seminar, co-sponsored with the Sales and Marketing Executives Association (SEMA) of Little Rock, will begin at 1:30 p.m. on March 21 and conclude at 4:30 p.m.

## Outstanding Alumni Receive Honors

### College of Arts and Sciences

During Homecoming '90 at the Black and Gold Banquet six outstanding alumni were named by the various colleges and schools at Harding. On this page are brief sketches of their accomplishments.

The six recipients received their awards from the deans of their respective colleges and schools.



John Wilson became Dean of Seaver College and a Professor of Religion at Pepperdine University after serving as Professor of Religious Studies at Southwest Missouri State University in Springfield, Mo., for almost 25 years.

After graduating magna cum laude from Harding with a double major in Bible and music in 1959, when he also served as president of the student body, he went to the Harding Graduate School of Religion, where he received

the master of arts. In 1967, he completed the Ph.D. from the University of Iowa.

He founded and directed the Christian Student Center at Southwest Missouri State, developing the program into one of the half dozen largest and best known among churches of Christ. He also directed a complete revision of the general studies core and chaired the Strategic Planning process for the university. In 1986, he was listed in Who's Who in Biblical Studies and Archaeology.

Wilson has lectured throughout the United States and in Australia, England and Europe. He has had numerous publications in scholarly journals and he serves as an elder in the Malibu Church of Christ.

He is married to the former Claudette Faulk (BS '62). Both John and Claudette were members of the original group of Belles and Beaux.



Gerald Ebker is an International Business Machines (IBM) vice president and he serves as president of the Federal Sector Division. He is responsible for IBM's operations with the federal government, including custom systems integration and aerospace solutions and commercial product offerings.

His interest in his company's responsibility does not end at the federal level, however. Following an innovative approach of introducing methods of im-

proving literacy of students in the Baltimore (Md.) City Public School System, the executive said, "If the Baltimore partnership succeeds, and I believe it will, both IBM and the City of Baltimore will be winners. But the biggest winners will be our real customers, the students, who will have a head start on becoming literate and productive members of society."

Ebker joined IBM in 1963 as a programmer on the Apollo space program. He became program manager in 1973 and was named manager of Software Systems in 1977. He was named president of the Federal Systems Division in 1987 and vice president in 1988. He has since been made president of the Federal Sector Division. He holds a master's in mathematics from Kansas State University. Ebker and his wife, Martha, reside in Potomac, Maryland.

### School of Nursing



Connie Bowers Edelman (BSN '79) is the assistant administrator, Patient Care Services, of Zale Lipshy University Hospital in Dallas. Prior to her appointment early in 1989, she was director of Critical Care Nursing at St. Paul Medical Center, in Dallas, where she had been employed since 1980.

At graduation from Harding, Connie spent a summer in Nigeria and Cameroon, Africa, at the Nigerian Christian Hospital and Cameroon Mobile Clinic. In 1985, she received the Master of Science with a focus on Clinical Nurse Specialist and Nursing Administration from Texas Woman's University.

She is a member of the American Association of Critical Care Nurses, having served in several capacities in the organization; the American and Texas Nurse Associations; the Nurses Advisory Council for Transplantation; Greater Dallas Area Nurse Executives; and University Hospital Consortium; and as the first president of North Texas Organization of Nurse Executives is currently organizing and establishing the first regional chapter. She has been recognized in Who's Who in American Nursing.

### College of Bible and Religion



Glenn Boyd is an Oklahoman who lists Searcy as his residence, but, as president of the African Christian Hospitals Foundation since 1981, he spends much of his time traveling on behalf of missions endeavors.

After earning a degree in music at Harding, he completed the M.A. in the first graduating class of Harding's Graduate School of Bible in 1953. He and his wife, Shirley Pegan (BA '52) Boyd, assisted in the beginning of Ohio Valley College in Parkersburg, W. Va., as Glenn preached in South Point, Ohio.

In 1958 the Boyds went to Karlsruhe, Germany, to spend 15 years as missionaries, moving in 1966 to Heidelberg to work in Pep-

perdine University's Year in Europe program. He was named director of the program from the Malibu campus in 1973 and taught as a professor of German. While in California, he received the M.A. in Missiology from Fuller Theological Seminary. He also completed in 1988 the Doctor of Missiology degree from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School in Chicago.

### School of Education



Benny Gooden (BA '66) became superintendent of the Fort Smith Public Schools in 1986. He began his educational career as a music instructor in nearby Alma, Ark., and has held administrative positions in Missouri schools from assistant principal to superintendent. In Boonville, Missouri, he served as superintendent



eight years before moving to Fort Smith.

He has been honored by the West Central Missouri School Administrators as the "Outstanding Active Superintendent" and has served as guest lecturer and university graduate school instructor. He has organized and performed with barber-shop quartets, community bands and choruses, and has served as musical director and conductor for musical theatre productions.

He and his wife, the former Martha Pittman (BA '67), have three children — Mike, a senior at ACU; Marc, a high school junior; and Leigh Ann, seventh grade.

Jim House has had a distinguished career with Arkansas Blue Cross and Blue Shield since he joined the company in 1967. # Medical Ethics Program Initiated

The Harding University Graduate School of Religion in Memphis has established a Center for Theology and Medical Ethics. A number of health care professionals have helped organize the ministry designed to serve Christians who work in the medical field.

Initially, the Center's focus will be designed to serve the theological, devotional and ethical needs for individuals in three different areas: Christians who have chosen health care professions; patients who need health care; and those who minister to or live with both groups.

Douglas Brown, Ph.D., has been appointed as the Center's first director. He is a lecturer in the area of medical ethics and also serves as a preacher. Brown has worked ten years as a full-time minister for various congregations throughout the nation. He has been a faculty member at the Graduate School of Religion since

1979 teaching courses in Christian ethics, providence and suffering and the history of Christian thought.

In the medical realm, Brown was a founding member of an ethics committee for the nation's first clinic dedicated to the gynecological needs of women with mental handicaps. He is also a visiting professor in medical ethics at the University of Michigan Medical School's Obstetrics and Gynecology Department. He has performed research work at the University of Tennessee Medical School since 1985 with an expert in the area of newborn care.

Experiences in Brown's personal life have given him insight into the field where theology and ethics meet. He waged a personal battle with the strain of disease and death through a 14-year struggle at the side of his first wife, a multiple sclerosis victim. As a parent of premature twins, he has been faced with the decisions involved in neonatal medicine.

## Spring Seminars Scheduled

The Graduate School of Religion will offer three continuing education seminars during the spring semester.

Dr. Allen Black, assistant professor of New Testament, will teach the first seminar Feb. 16. The subject will be "Teaching the Gospel of Mark." The seminar will be held on the Memphis campus.

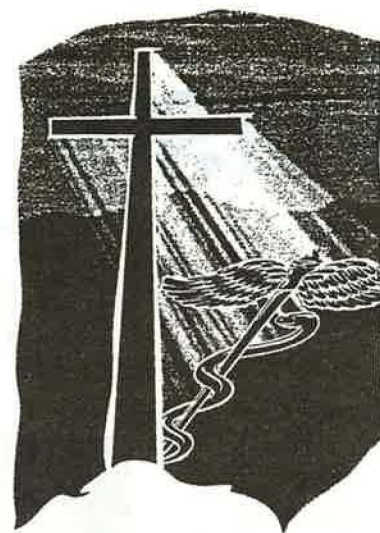
On March 23 the "Counseling for Church Leaders" seminar will be conducted at the North Jackson Church of Christ in Jackson, Tenn. Directing the seminar will be Dr. Bill Flatt, professor of counseling, and Dr. Billy

Watson, a certified marital and family therapist.

Another counseling seminar, "An Emerging Eclectic Approach to Marital and Family Therapy," has been scheduled for May 4 on the Memphis campus. Dr. Flatt and Dr. Joel Johnson, associate professor of counseling, will be the program.

All three seminars will begin at 9 a.m. and conclude by 4 p.m.

Registration is required by Tuesday before each seminar meets. The registration fee is \$30 per seminar.



"Many people in the medical field face a fatiguing work schedule and a never-ending struggle with pain and suffering. Working in this type of environment can be spiritually draining, and I feel this center will help provide a relief from daily strains," said Brown.

Establishing this Center in association with Harding University Graduate School of Religion and locating its work in Memphis where there is a major medical center with teaching and research facilities provides chances to reach a large populace. Opportunities at the Center will include a hotline for access to medical ethics literature, the availability of a consultant to research pressing ethical decisions and to assist in meeting the spiritual needs of medical missionaries. Regional seminars for health care professionals, a week-long ethics seminar for pre-med students and clinical research in medical ethics will be additional features of the Center.

In addition to Brown, three other men comprise the board for the new Center. Dr. David Smith, a Little Rock cardiologist, Dr. David LaVelle, an orthopedic surgeon from Memphis, and Paul Gardner, executive director of the Arkansas Cancer Research Center, have taken the lead in securing the financial support for the Center for Theology and Medical Ethics.

## Memorial Gifts

Memorial gifts to Harding at the death of a friend or relative continue to be a good way to express sympathy while at the same time helping to provide a Christian education for Harding students.

Usually the funds received as memorial gifts are used in the university's general fund. However, donors may request their gifts go to a specific fund.

Harding's Development Office has a special memorial gift packet available to assist individuals in making memorial gifts.

The packet contains an expression of sympathy that is mailed directly to the bereaved family. It also contains a card and reply envelope that are sent to Harding with the donor's memorial gift.

Once the gift is received by Harding, staff members in the Development Office send an acknowledgement of the gift to the family of the deceased individual.

Last year more than \$40,000 was contributed to Harding as the result of memorial gifts.

Memorial gift packets may be obtained by writing the Development Office, Box 941, Harding University, Searcy, AR 72143. Individuals will be sent three packets of materials.

## Catherine W. Riggs Loan Fund

Catherine W. Riggs of Little Rock, a long-time supporter of Harding, has established a loan fund at the university to help students finance their education.

Mrs. Riggs is retired from her employment with the Missouri Pacific Railroad. She worked for the company from 1942 until 1973.

"She has been a good friend of Harding for a long time. She has helped in many of Harding's fund raising projects," said Dr. Clifton L. Ganus, Jr., chancellor of Harding.

"The loan fund which she has established will be very helpful to many young people for years to come. We are very grateful for her interest in the work at Harding and for her helpfulness to our students," said Ganus.

Although retired, Mrs. Riggs is a volunteer at University Hospital in Little Rock and she is an active participant in the World Bible School Program at the Sixth and Izard Church of Christ where she attends. She has been particularly active in the World Bible School efforts with the 26,000 Romanians who have requested Bible study and Bibles.

## Smith Scholarship

A scholarship for Bible majors has been funded in the memory of William W. Smith through the estate of his widow Clara Edna Smith. The Smiths were steadfast Christians who wanted to continue in the Lord's work even after their death. Therefore, in order to accomplish such a purpose, Mrs. Smith left a portion of her estate to Harding to assist in training young preachers.

The couple was married in 1934 in Houston, Texas. Mrs. Smith's maiden name and married name were the same so she never had to change her last name. Mr. Smith was a builder and a carpenter. Mrs. Smith worked for Southwestern Bell Telephone for 38 years and in her spare time created many beautiful oil paintings. The couple attended the Central Church of Christ in Houston, Texas, until they moved to Manvel, Texas, where they remained for the rest of their lives.

## NASA Proposal Submitted

A consortium of seven Arkansas universities, including Harding, have submitted a grant proposal for \$150,000 from the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) to participate in the National Space Grant College and Fellowships Program.

The universities, all of which currently have aerospace or aerospace-related research programs, are Arkansas State University; University of Arkansas, Fayetteville; University of Arkansas at Little Rock; University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences; University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff and University of Central Arkansas.

The NASA grants program is similar to the Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research, a program funded by the National Science Foundation which supports three centers of scientific excellence to improve Arkansas' ability to compete for federal research monies.

# It's Sweeter the Second Time Around

For the Lady Bison volleyball team its second Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference championship was sweeter than the first.

In 1989 the team tied with Southern Arkansas University for the AIC crown. In 1990 the Lady Bisons won their first outright championship posting an 11-1 conference record and a 34-5 overall record.

During the year the team played in tournament finals at Ouachita Baptist University, Christian College and the University of Tennessee-Martin.

The Lady Bisons hosted the NAIA District 17 Tournament in Searcy at the Ganus Athletic Center. Harding drew the number one seed with the best record and the best power rating. The team's opponent was Arkansas Tech University, the number eight seed.

Harding had defeated the Tech Golden Suns three times during the season in three close matches. The Golden Suns pulled off the upset, defeating Harding in five close games and ending the Lady Bisons dream of going to the national championships.

Members of the team and their coach have received post-season honors.

Coach Karyl Bailey was named both AIC and NAIA District 17 Coach of the Year.

Bailey began the program in 1963 with a no-scholarship program and a 4-17 team. In 1989 and 1990 his teams had two AIC championships and a 78-13 record.

Stephanie Dempsay, a 5-8 setter from Bedford, Texas, was an NAIA All-District performer in 1990. In 1989 she was named All-AIC. She is a math education major.

# Bison Football Team Completes 6-4 Season

Playing one of the toughest schedules of any NAIA Division I school, Harding's Bison football team finished the 1990 season with a respectable 6-4 record.

Only three of the Bisons' opponents were not ranked in the nation's top 20 when they played the Bisons. Harding's team was ranked in the top 20 all year and finished the season at the number 16 spot. The Bisons were ranked as high as third during the season.

The team began by reeling off a 4-1 record in the first half of the season. The lone loss was a 21-14 defeat at the hands of the nemesis Hornets from Emporia State (Kan.) in the opening game.

In the win column Harding downed Lane College, 38-0; Evangel College, 27-20; Southeastern Oklahoma University, 15-14;

and Arkansas Tech University, 24-10, in the first Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference game.

The second half of the season was much more difficult for the Bisons as the team ran into some tough AIC competitors.

Harding began the second half of the season dropping two consecutive contests. The University of Central Arkansas Bears defeated the Bisons 10-6 in a game that set an attendance record at Alumni Field. More than 6,000 saw the game.

UCA went on to finish the year 6-0 in the conference. In 1989 UCA and Harding tied for the AIC crown.

Ouachita Baptist University was the only nationally unranked team to face the Bisons in the second half of the season. OBU upset the Bisons 24-7 in what was the

low point of the season for Coach Larry Richmond and his squad.

The Bisons got back on the winning track in the Homecoming contest Oct. 27 with a 10-9 victory over the University of Arkansas at Monticello. The Homecoming crowd of more than 5,000 saw the Bisons beat UAM for the first time since 1975.

In the season's final two games Harding split with its opponents, losing to Henderson State University, 13-3, and defeating Southern Arkansas University, 29-14, in the season finale.

In the final game of the season Bison fans got a taste of what they might see in the 1991 season as junior Darrell Biggers and sophomore Richard Holmes both rushed for more than 100 yards.

"I believe we had a good season," Richmond said in evaluating the 1990 campaign. "We played really well most of the season. There were a couple of close losses that really hurt us, but we had a good year."

Among the bright spots in the Bisons' season was the play of the defensive unit, especially the defensive secondary. In every game coaches and fans alike will remember the big defensive plays that determined the outcome of the game.

The kicking game was also a big plus for Harding in 1990. Placekicker Brent Goodwin broke the school record with a 54-yard field goal against Southeastern Oklahoma and later in the season tied that mark. In

the final game of the season he connected from 40 and 52 yards against Southern Arkansas.

In the punting category Mark Thomas was consistently an AIC leader with points averaging more than 40 yards per kick.

The Bisons lose 13 seniors from the 1990 squad, including the entire defensive secondary. Richmond and his assistant coaches have already hit the recruiting trail looking at freshmen prospects for 1991.

Post-season honors have recognized several members of the team. Named to the 1990 All-AIC team were defensive lineman Kenwick Thompson of Houston, linebacker Patrick Gill of Hallsville, Tex., defensive back Lance Rodgers of Ponca City, Okla., return specialist Eric Cook of Batesville, Miss., and the kicking duo of Thomas of

Crowley, Tex., and Goodwin of Palatine, Ill.

Thompson was also selected as the **Arkansas Democrat's** Defensive Player of the Year.

Also receiving second team and honorable mention All-AIC recognition were Chio Ford of Sikeston, Mo., Biggers of Augusta, Ark., Barry Bowens of Lewisville, Tex., Detric Cathey of Coldwater, Miss., Jay Johnson of Marietta, Ohio, Pete Phillis of Savanna, Ill., Lance Proctor of Plano, Tex., Matt Thompson of Huntsville, Ala., and Lee White of Houston.

## Lady Harriers Claim Sixth AIC Championship

The Lady Bison cross country team continued its winning ways by easily claiming both the Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference and NAIA District 17 championships.

Harding's men's team did not fare quite as well in the championship race, finishing third in the contest. It was the first time in 20 years the men's team had failed to win the AIC championship.

In winning the 1990 crown, the Lady Bisons extended their winning streak to six consecutive conference championships and six trips to the NAIA national meet in Kenosha, Wisc.

Junior Kelsie Hutchison won the individual championship with a time of 18:45 over the 3.1 mile course. Shauna Queen was third (19:15), Vicki Lawrence finished seventh (20:11) and Valerie McCammon (20:32) and Shelley Johnson (21:40) were tenth and eleventh.

Rounding out the seven member team were Lori Woodson, thirteenth, and Wendi Scot, sixteenth. Forty-one runners finished the race.

Youth is a definite feature of the Lady Bisons with Hutchison and Scott the only juniors on the squad. All seven, plus Keri Hutchison who is out with a broken foot, will be back in 1991 to

provide the nucleus of what coach Ted Lloyd could be a "top 15 team" in the NAIA.

In the men's division the individual champion was Sebastian Villavu of Henderson State University. He covered the 4.95 mile course in 24:45. HSU won the team championship with 30 points. The Reddies had four of the top seven runners.

Harding's top runner was Tim Seay with a time of 26:34 and a seventh place finish. Freshman Joe Bontrager finished tenth in 26:46. Both Seay and Bontrager were named All-AIC for their efforts.

Other Bison competitors were Nathan Mills, 12th;

Kevin Yaws, 14th; Damon Work, 15th; Greg Richey, 18th; and Ken Edwards, 19th.

The men's team is also young and inexperienced. Only Yaws and Edwards are seniors and only Richey and

Edwards had ever run in an AIC championship meet.

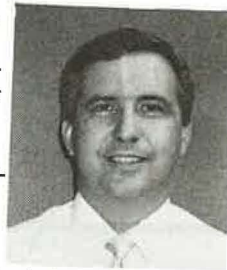
